Importance

Thanks to our newest board member, we now have a full and functioning board. Serving on the board can be a rewarding experience and a wonderful opportunity to have your voice heard. The board talks finances, events for Citadel residents, ways to keep our neighborhood both safe and beautiful. We need a board to vote on important items and make sure that Citadel continues to thrive.

Duties

The duties vary a bit based on whether you are an officer or not. However, your basic duties entail attending monthly board meetings, quarterly Citadel meetings and special meetings, as needed. You are expected to vote on items from monthly minutes to how grant money will be spent. There is an expectation to be neighborly and to uphold our bylaws.

Positions

There are six key positions: (1) President, (2) Vice President, (3) Treasurer, (4) Recording Secretary, (5) Corresponding Secretary and (6) Member. Each position follows the duties previously mentioned. Officers have specific duties that are detailed in the bylaws.

Length of Terms

Each full term lasts for three years. There are exceptions when a new member takes over a position that was vacated early.

The ABCs of Assessments

Yearly, Citadel residents are asked to pay homeowner assessment dues as part of their commitment to living in this division. These fees are required and addressed in the bylaws. The fees pay for summer nightly security, landscaping, cultural events, office rental fees, etc.... All residents are expected to pay their assessments by March 31st of each year or risk having a lien put on their property.
